Council Highlights from March 14th Council Meeting: CORRESPONDENCE: We received lovely thank you letters from St. Bernadette and Hillcrest schools thanking the congregation for their White gift donations in Dec. FINANCE: The treasurer submitted end of year financial statements and presented the 2023 budget. In general, 2022 was a tough year, good things such as upgrades, repairs, building improvements happened, however, expenses were also up. The wage subsidy and roof fund helped in 2022. Expenses are fairly fixed and recurring costs are consistent. The greening of the building should help slightly. The 2023 budget was created as conservatively as possible. Projected revenues don't include anything extraordinary such as wage subsidy which we have seen in previous years. The budget for tech has increased and the treasurer will give a greater breakdown for this at the Annual Meeting. M&P: Recommended that Rev. Scott attend a Young Leaders conference on April 13th & 14th and the Revitalize Conference June 7th – 11th. **PROPERTY MAINTENANCE**: A programable thermostat was installed in the social hall. The LED lighting project will be completed in March. WORSHIP: Committee is looking into holding a music night possibly in May. Recommended that masks are no longer mandatory in the sanctuary. A "mask mandatory" pew will be available. France will begin to use the organ again. NOMINATIONS: currently there is no chair. Marlene M. will read the report at the annual meeting. UCW/CRAFT GROUP: Craft group and UCW meets regularly. Bridge will wrap on for the season on March 23rd. FUNDRAISING/ TRUSTEES: There are some fundraisers on the horizon. Sobeys cards will be available in the next couple of weeks, and a rummage sale in April. NEW BUSINESS: Visioning Report presentation will be held on May 6th at 9:00am in the church hall.
