In Belgium I have studied at the IBB (Institut Biblique de Belgique, Institut supérieur de sciences religieuse). Since 1995 -2001, I have worked as a religion teacher in Belgium and in Germany. I also served in a church (Chapelle Baptiste de Jemeppe) as an assistant pastor and then I become an ordained pastor in 2001 at the same church.

<u>2010-2013</u>: Volunteer in Multicultural Association Chaleur Region, I have been the secretary and the president. Welcoming and integrating newcomers in our country is a wonderful experience, my background has been a good experience to serve our newcomers and to raise awareness in our region.

<u>2014-2020</u>: I have quit the Baptist Church and become part as a member of The United Church of Canada. By the help of Rev. Blair Lewis who has been a great mentor for me, I have applied for an admission process in The United Church of Canada.

<u>2015-2018</u>: Pulpit Supply ministry for the UCC in Loggieville, Black River, Hardwick, Napam, Bathurst, Clifton and Campbellton.
